- 2 1 vase, 3 stems, different colours
- 3 1 specimen bloom, red or pink
4. 1 specimen bloom, any colour
5. 1 specimen bloom, scented

PHYLLIS FOWLER ROSE BOWL

First won in 1967

For outstanding exhibit in class 6

- 6 One bowl of roses

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS

J. NEWMAN TROPHY

First won in 1994

For outstanding exhibit in class 7-8

- 7 1 vase of 3 stems of summer flowers
- 8 1 vase of mixed summer flowers

HERBS AND SALAD

JUBILEE CUP

First won in 1977

For outstanding exhibit in classes 9-10

- 9 Bunch of herbs, 5 different kinds
- 10 Collection of 5 mixed salad items displayed in a bowl or on a plate

- 11 Dish of 5, one variety of any type of berries, redcurrants or blackcurrants
