Welcome to the Wolvercote & Wytham Midsummer Festival's Flag Treasure Trail!

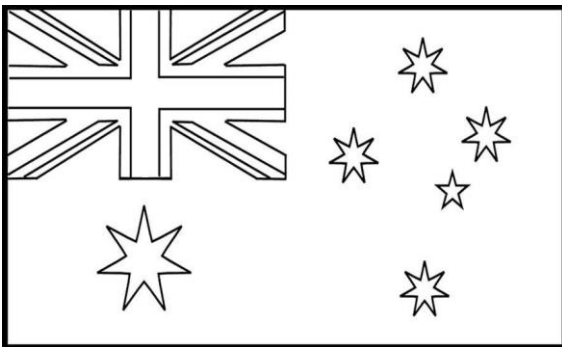
See how many of these national and regional flags you can spot around our villages. Colour them in correctly, to show you've seen them and try to collect the whole 'passport'!

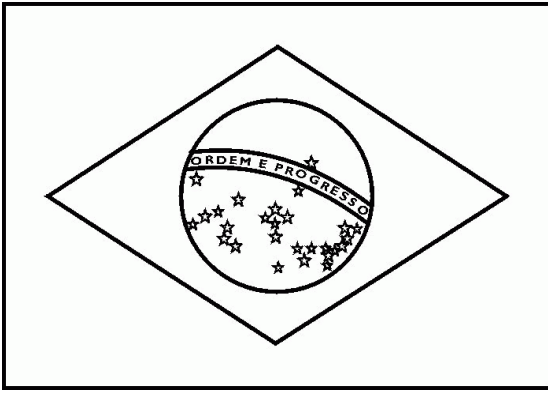
AUSTRALIA

BRAZIL

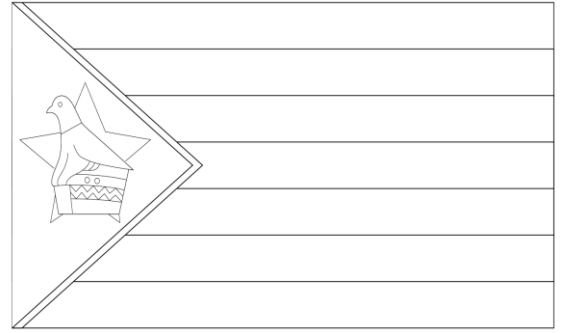
ADDRESS WHERE SPOTTED:

ZIMBABWE

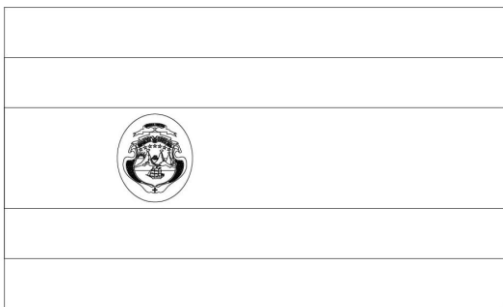

COSTA RICA

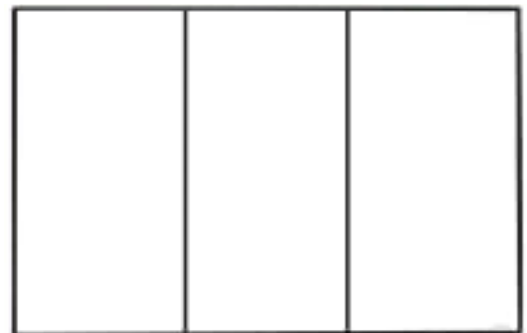
ADDRESS WHERE SPOTTED:

You could peruse Rosamund Road if you wanted to spot the flag of Wales.

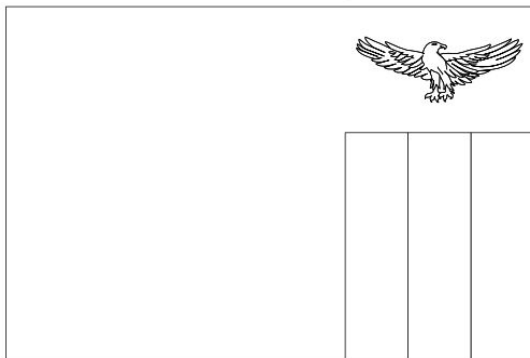


AUSTRIA

when searching for the Zambian flag.

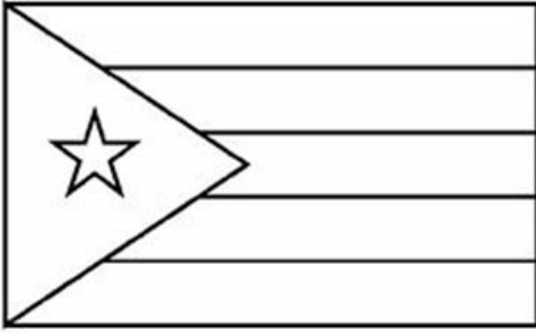


CANADA

when searching for the Canadian flag.



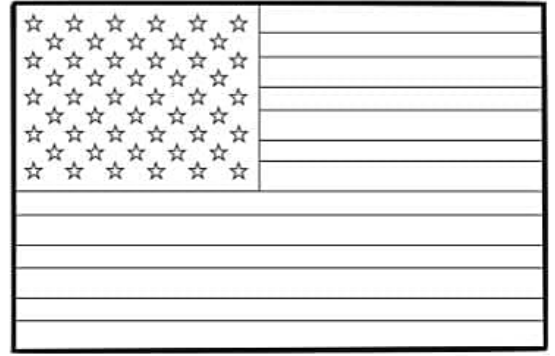
CUBA

for a chance to spot the flag of Cuba.



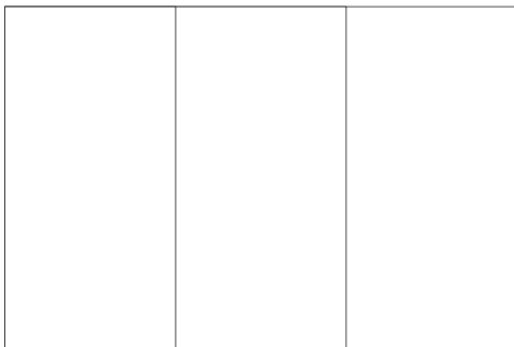
UNITED STATES of AMERICA

when searching for a flag from the USA.



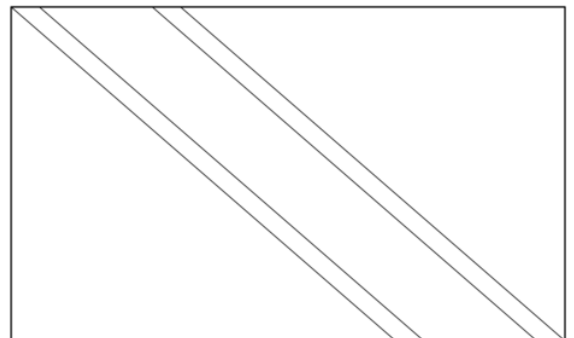
FRANCE

for the chance to spot France's flag.



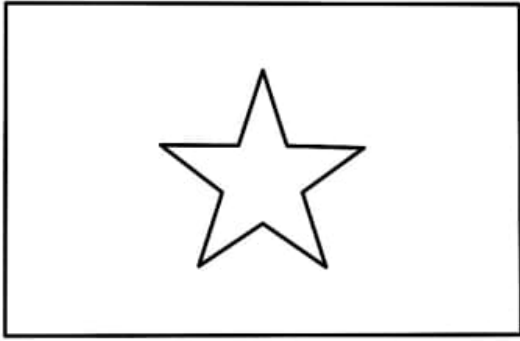
TRINIDAD & TOBAGO

Trinidad and Tobago.



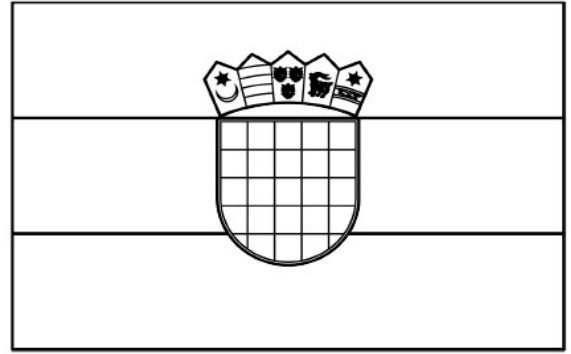
VIETNAM

when searching for the Croatian flag.



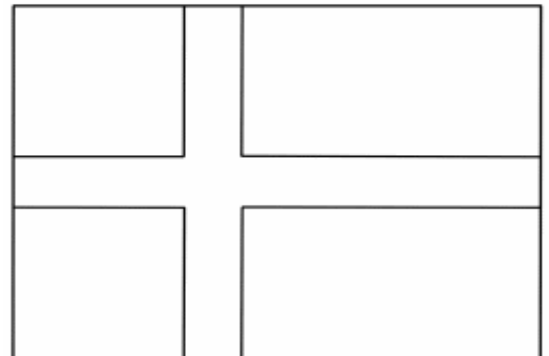
UKRAINE

GERMANY

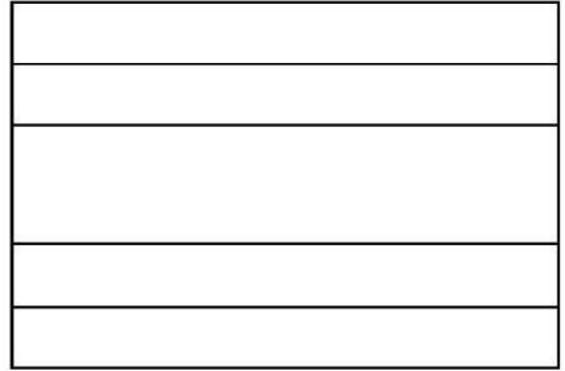
ADDRESS WHERE SPOTTED:

THAILAND

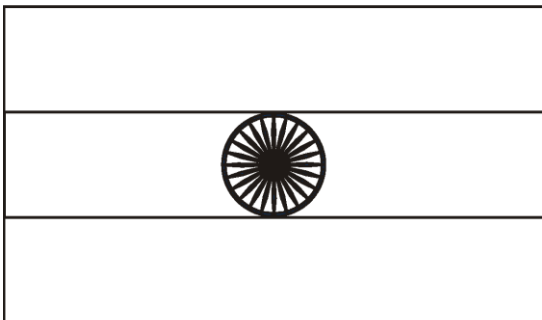
ADDRESS WHERE SPOTTED:

INDIA

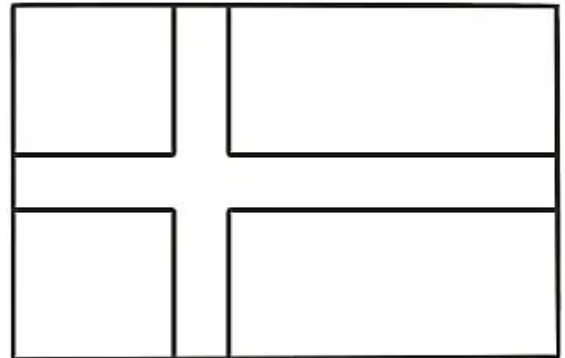
ADDRESS WHERE SPOTTED:

SWEDEN

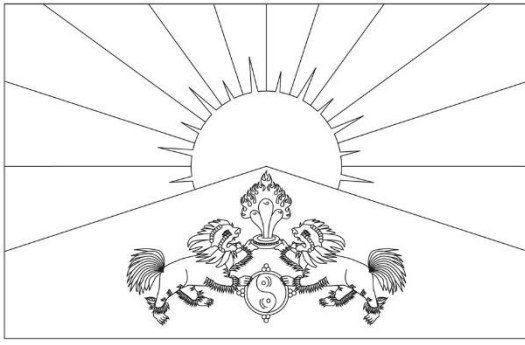
ADDRESS WHERE SPOTTED:

Walk along Godstow Road for a chance to spot the flag of Sweden.



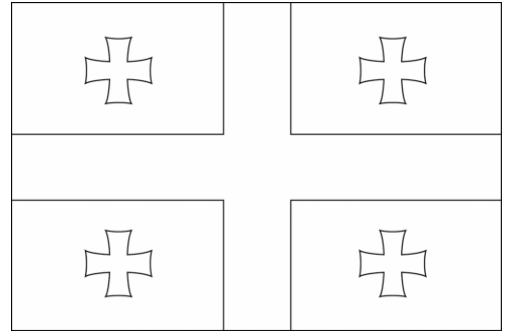
TIBET

when searching for the Tibetan flag.



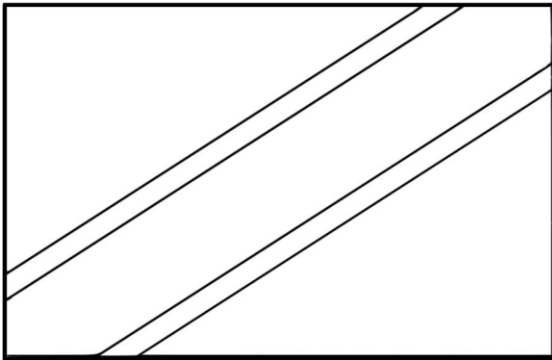
GEORGIA

when searching for the flag of Georgia.



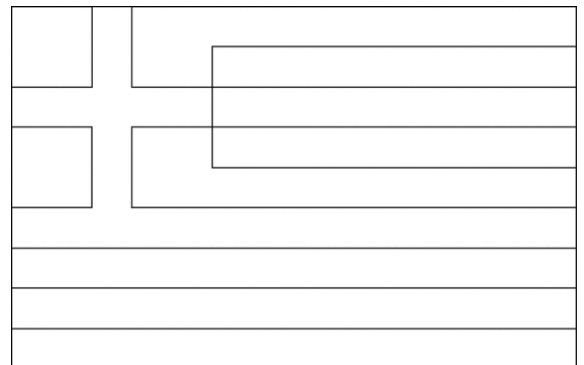
TANZANIA

when searching for the Tanzanian flag.



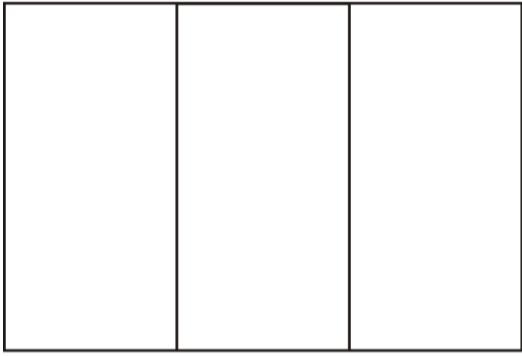
GREECE

Wander around Wytham for a chance to spot the Greek flag.



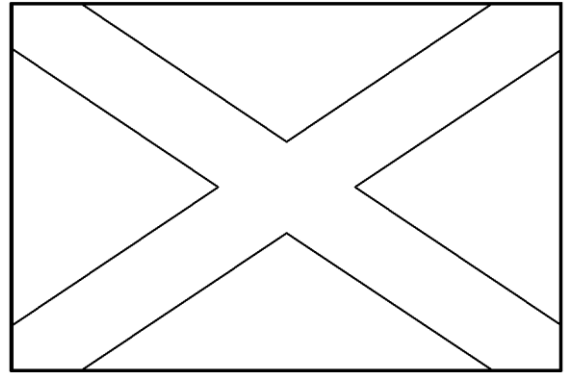
ITALY

for a chance to spot the Italian flag.



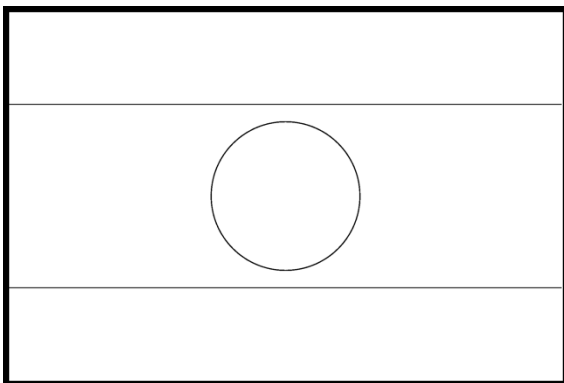
SCOTLAND

when searching for the Scottish flag.



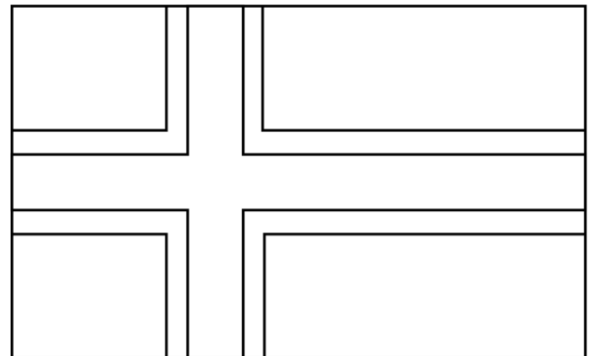
LAOS

when searching for the flag of Laos.



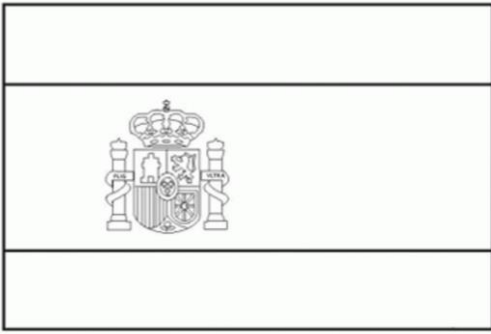
ORKNEY

Ireland is the only country in the world to have a musical instrument as its national symbol.

Hint:
You could wander through Wytham when searching for the Irish flag.
Can you spot it anywhere else? There's more than one!



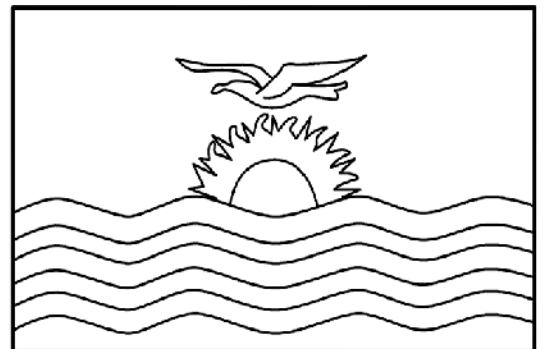
POLAND

Poland is home to Europe's heaviest land animal, the European bison. They can, on average, weigh up to 920 kgs – but the heaviest one ever recorded weighed a whopping 1,900 kgs!!

Meander along Rosamund Road when searching for the Polish flag.



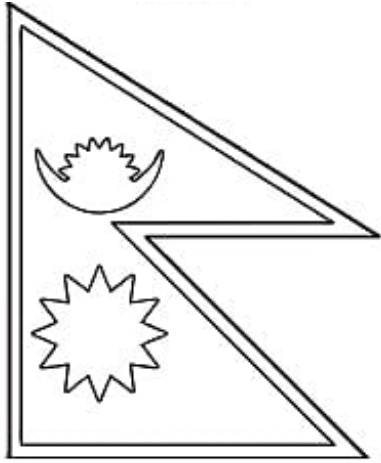
KIRIBATI

THE NETHERLANDS

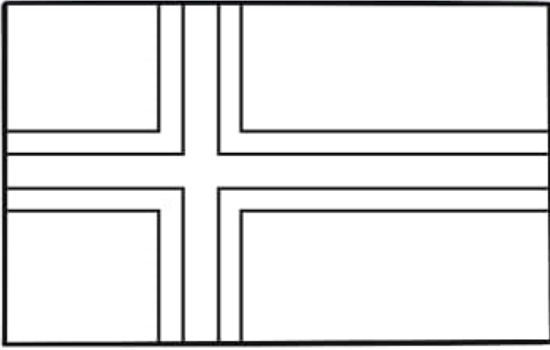
ADDRESS WHERE SPOTTED:
