Awarded by her to WHS and dedicated to her in 2002.

Won for the first time by the late Mr William Taylor.

FRED PARGETER CUP (children's classes) Donated by Sheila Pargeter in 2006, in memory of her late husband, Fred Pargeter.

Awarded to the Exhibitor of the Year – defined as the person who has produced the most successful range of exhibits over all WHS Shows during the current year. This shall be determined from the records kept by the Show Secretary, using the following points system:

Winning a Cup or Trophy	4 points
A First Place Certificate	3 points
A Second Place Certificate	2 points
A Third Place Certificate	1 point

The winner will retain the cup until the Autumn Show of the following year and may have the plinth engraved, at his/her own expense, if desired.

THE BANKSIAN MEDAL

Awarded to the person who has accrued the most points in the vegetable, fruit and flower categories, excluding flower arranging. (NB: winners from the previous 2 years are not eligible)
